Every year at the AGM, we look back to see the progress we have taken to continue to shape Bereaved Families of Ontario South Central Region in our mission to support our community members with their journey through grief. Over the past eighteen months, our accomplishments and challenges have been many.

For us, 2019 felt like a "strength-in-the-basics" year of growth. It was a year of reflection on what our purpose was; on how we can continue to best serve our community in learning to live with grief. Our focus has truly been on ensuring our programming continues to be effective and inclusive. In 2019, we reviewed and enhanced current programs and created new programs where we saw a community need. The cornerstone of our programming is our volunteer facilitators. Ensuring they had the knowledge, training and support they needed was a top priority. This led to robust growth in our facilitator training programs. To accomplish all of this, it also meant expansion and enrichment in our local and provincial partnerships and bettered communication within BFO chapters.

The pandemic changed the way people interact on a whole and dramatically changed the way our peer support groups functioned. With 2019's focus on enriching our programming, supporting our volunteers, and cultivating our partnerships, we were much better prepared to navigate the storms ahead. We were quickly able to adapt to the new environment and create an impactful way to continue peer support in a virtual environment.

We are especially grateful to Krista Campure, who joined BFO-SCR as our Executive Director in 2019. Her knowledge and compassion fueled the "strength-in-the-basics" growth and her innovation and commitment helped BFO-SCR and many other chapters understand how to move to virtual support. I also want to thank my fellow board members who volunteer their expertise to navigate this ship that is BFO-SCR, ensuring we continue to be able to serve our community. We value the insight and expertise that the members of the Professional Advisory Committee provide. And we are most grateful to our volunteers, who are truly the heart and soul of our organization. We of course, could not succeed without them. We also want to thank all BFO-SCR friends, community partners and supporters. I am so grateful to be part of an organization that is run through compassion for supporting the community we live in. I look forward to seeing what the future has in store for us.

A MESSAGE FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

The past year has been a time of both change and reflection for Bereaved Families of Ontario South Central Region. We have experienced numerous changes in staff, board members and our environment as we continue to navigate the COVID-19 pandemic.

I stepped into the role of Executive Director in August, 2019. At that time, I worked to re-establish community support and grief support programs as we embraced the fall season. In September, three Sheridan College students from the Social Service Worker program joined BFO-SCR to complete their practicums. Some of you may have had the pleasure of chatting with Shanna, Shannon and Allison. Esme, a Laurier University student of Social Work, joined BFOSCR in January of this year. Each of these students have been amazing additions to our team. They assisted in office administration, program development, facilitator training and eventually they all became wonderful group facilitators.

In October of 2019, we created a new support group called Mixed Loss, which provided grief support for adults of all ages, for any type of loss and at any stage of their grieving journey. That support program successfully continued through the winter months and eventually became our virtual adult support program, now called Healing with Hope. Since April 2020, the program has been funded by the United Way of Haldimand-Norfolk COVID-19 Response Fund.

When the COVID-19 pandemic shut down Ontario last spring, we quickly transitioned to virtual support groups for all our in-session winter and spring grief support groups. For those who were unable to transition or accommodate the virtual platform, Shanna, our social service worker graduate and I provided one-to-one, peer-to-peer phone support. Since then, we have provided more than 140 peer-to-peer phone support sessions bridging individuals to grief support programs or providing referrals to a local counsellor or therapist for further support.

In June, we applied for the Emergency Community Support Fund through Hamilton Community Foundations and were successfully granted funds to create an online family bereavement program. This program combines TLC, our children's grief support program, and our Caregivers Supporting Children support program, into a virtual support program. Our current Laurier student of Social Work, Melissa, the TLC volunteer facilitators, Larissa and I are in the midst of successfully implementing the first online family bereavement support program consisting of five children. The families involved have been very receptive, appreciative and highly engaged.

For the remainder of 2020, Bereaved Families of Ontario South Central Region will continue to provide virtual support programs and facilitator training, as the health and safety of our participants, volunteers and staff is of paramount importance.

I want to take a moment to thank every volunteer that has stepped up, assisted in the office and at events, adapted to all the changes and stayed committed during the whirlwind of the pandemic. Thank you for being there to support every group participant, event attendee, for answering phone calls, and for supporting me as I navigated through this new role. Your efforts are truly appreciated.

MISSING PIECES: THE GRIEF PUZZLE


A one-day workshop for teens who have experienced the death of a loved one. Programs offered in collaboration with Hamilton and Halton School Boards.

COMMUNITY IMPACT

2019 Highlights

- ~ Our volunteers provided over 890 hours of program support, in-office support and during events.
- ~ We completed our M.A.i.D program development phase for our Ontario Trillium Foundation grant.
- We launched our new Mixed Loss Grief Support Group for adults of all ages, during any stage of grief and any type of loss.
- ~ Our support groups reached across Hamilton, Burlington and into the Haldimand-Norfolk Regions.

Geographic Region




COMMUNITY IMPACT

Early 2020 Highlights

- We ran a successful Facilitator Training Workshop in January recruiting 10 new volunteer facilitators.
- ~ Our volunteers have already provided over 490 hours of in-person and virtual support and in-office support (as of June 23rd, 2020).
- We were awarded two one-year grants through United Way of Haldimand-Norfolk. The purpose of one grant is to run a facilitator training workshop in the Haldimand-Norfolk region to increase support within the region. The purpose of the other grant, COVID-19 Response Fund, is to help provide virtual support groups for adults within our community during the pandemic. We successfully launched Healing for Hope, our online adult bereavement program on May 19th, 2020.
- We were recently awarded a one-year grant, Emergency Community Support Fund, from Hamilton Community Foundation for a Family Bereavement Program for grieving children and their families/caregivers during the pandemic. This program is in the development stage as we are transitioning our TLC/CSC program into a virtual platform and online children's library.






2020 Fundraising Events

- ~ To start off the year, Snapdragon Educational Busy Bags ran a fundraiser in support of BFOSCR in January. The weekend fundraising event raised around \$160 for our support programs.
- $\sim\,\,$ The Burlington Concert Band donated their bake sale profits from their "For the Love of Music" Concert on Friday February 7th, 2020. They raised \$300 for BFOSCR.
- We ran our first FUNDrive event in February collecting donations of used clothing, household goods and books. We donated over 808lbs of clothing!
- Due to unfortunate circumstances including the shutdown of all events due to COVID-19, we had to cancel our Spring Market event in March.
- ~ National Puddle Day went virtual for the 10th Annual event by hosting a virtual splash party and WestJet ticket raffle. The virtual event stirred up a little fun during the pandemic and raised around \$1,800 in support of grieving families.
- COVID-19 has hit our fundraising events hard. We will continue to run virtual and mini fundraising events during the rest of the year. We will keep you posted on how you can help and how you can support our grief support programs.
- ~ The 15th Annual Butterfly Release Memorial ran as a virtual presentation in September and generated just over \$2,200 in support of grief support programs for grieving families and individuals in our community.
- We have just launched the Family Tree of Lights Candlelight Vigil, which will be held virtually as a live event.
