A MESSAGE FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR & PROGRAM COORDINATOR

Over the past year we have been able to adapt and shift to the constant changes due to the ongoing pandemic. We have retained a virtual support platform for many of the grief support programs and services that we continue to offer for bereaved individuals and families as well as re-established in-person grief support programs to help reduce the barriers and access to support. We are extremely grateful for the financial assistance provided by Community Foundations of Canada over the past year to help keep our programs and services free and accessible for the community. With this funding, we have successfully launched a grief support program with the assistance of one of our Sheridan placement students studying social service work specializing in gerontology for seniors sixty years of age and older. This was an essential step in reducing isolation for our senior population and providing companionship during unprecedented times.

This led the way as we excitedly transitioned our Annual Butterfly Release and Memorial Walk back to an inperson event at Hidden Valley Park in Burlington back in June. Navigating through new policies and procedures related to the pandemic and park renovations, we were awarded with the pleasure of interacting and engaging with our community members and supporters during this very successful and well attended event. We are looking forward to next year's Butterfly Release and Memorial Walk event.

We would like to take a moment to thank each and every volunteer, sponsor, supporter and donor for all your support, time, energy and compassion. Without you we would not exist. Thank you for your commitment, dedication and encouragement.

As this inspires hope and positive change moving forward, we are thrilled to announce that Ontario Trillium Foundation has accepted our grant proposal for sustaining our current grief support programs and services, as well as essential funding to create a grief support program and facilitator training for an LGBTQIA+ grief support program. We are in the early stages of the program research and development, but we are excited to expand into creating and cultivating a safe space for the LGBTQIA+ community to access much needed support and services. We will keep everyone informed of our progress and the official launch of this grief support program.

Now that we are heading well into the second half of 2022, we will continue to provide both virtual and inperson support based on the demographic and geographic needs of the group participants for our fall and winter program schedule. As we are continually adapting and expanding, we will continue to provide enriched and enhanced facilitator training for both new recruitment and current facilitator and staff education.

We are looking forward to our next community event, our annual Family Tree of Lights Ceremony in December. Save the date for December 15th, 2022!

OUR VISION

Bereaved Families of Ontario - South Central Region is a non-profit organization whose purpose is to provide well organized, and professionally supervised, peer-to-peer grief support programs for bereaved families and individuals who have lost a loved one through death. All grief support programs are offered **free** of charge.



OUR MISSION

To create a caring, compassionate, non-judgmental peer support and educational environment for individuals and families who are bereaved to openly connect with others and develop a better understanding of the powerful emotions of grief and loss.

BFO-SCR PROGRAMS

ADULT PROGRAMS

BEREAVED PARENTS SUPPORT PROGRAM

10-week grief support group for individuals or couples who have experienced the death of a child (adult or young child).

PREGNANCY AND INFANT LOSS SUPPORT PROGRAM

10-week grief support program for individuals or couples who have experienced a miscarriage, stillbirth or early infant loss.

HEALING WITH HOPE – MIXED LOSS SUPPORT PROGRAM

8-week grief support program for general adult bereavement. Adults 18+ years of age, for any type of loss and at any point in your grief. Support after the death of a parent, grandparent, sibling, relative, partner, spouse, or friend.

ADULT BEREAVEMENT DROP-IN SUPPORT PROGRAM (HEALING WITH HOPE OPEN)

Held virtually two times per month for a total of 4 sessions per season. Adults 18+ years of age, for any type of loss and at any point in your grief. Support after the death of a parent, grandparent, sibling, relative, partner, spouse, or friend.

MAID SUPPORT PROGRAM – MEDICAL ASSISTANCE IN DYING

8-week grief support program for adults who have experienced a medically assisted death of a loved one.

SENIOR SUPPORT PROGRAM

8-week grief support program held in-person.

Adults 60+ years of age, for any type of loss and at any point in your grief. Support after the death of a parent, grandparent, sibling, relative, partner, spouse, or friend.

YOUNG ADULT GRIEF SUPPORT

Drop-in grief support group for young adults aged 18-29 years, who have experienced a death of a loved one. Support after the death of a parent, grandparent, sibling, relative, partner, spouse, or friend.

FAMILY BEREAVEMENT SUPPORT PROGRAM

TLC: TALK, LISTEN, CARE FOR KIDS & CSC: CAREGIVERS SUPPORTING CHILDREN 8-week grief support program for children aged 5-13 years and their caregivers. Support after the death of a parent, sibling, relative or friend.

MISSING PIECES: THE GRIEF PUZZLE


Held as a one-day workshop offered in collaboration with Hamilton District Public and Catholic School Boards. Drop-in support program for teens aged 13-19 years, who have experienced the death of a loved one.



COMMUNITY IMPACT

2021 HIGHLIGHTS

- ~ Our volunteers devoted over 1991 hours of program, event, and office support.
- We continued to provide virtual support programs as we continued to navigate through the pandemic alongside a substantial increase in one-to-one support sessions provided by volunteers and staff.
- We held three facilitator training sessions in March, August, and November where we recruited 9 new volunteers.
- \sim We have a total of 50 volunteers at BFO-SCR.
- With most of our support groups running virtual, we have been able to successfully reach a larger population and broader geographic area.
- Our support groups have reached across Hamilton, Burlington, Brantford, Haldimand-Norfolk, and Niagara region, as well as a variety of other areas outside of our catchment region including Toronto, Scarborough, St. Thomas, Woodstock, Guelph, etc.





COMMUNITY IMPACT

2022 Highlights

- We successfully utilized the funding granted to us by Community Foundations of Canada -Canada Healthy Communities Initiative, which provided funding through 2021 and early 2022.
- We were able to provide educational workshops and support for Grand Council Treaty #3 in Kenora in late January and February for teachers, social workers, counsellors, leadership staff and council members.
- We were recruited to by the Hamilton Family Health Team to provide a free workshop in April 2022 to discuss the needs of grieving children and adolescent in the community. We were also able to educate the HFHT on all the different programs, services and resources within our organization to enrich the services and support network for families in the community.
- We were granted funding by Ontario Trillium Foundation Resilient Communities Fund for our adult and youth grief support programs, as well as the for development of an LGBTQIA+ grief support program.
- We revealed, recognized, and removed the barriers to access care for our senior community and caregivers of children by launching and reinstating these grief support programs safely back inperson. The first senior grief support program was launched in March and successfully ran for 8weeks at L.G. Wallace Funeral Home. Our TLC/CSC grief support program returned in May 2022.
- With majority of our support groups continuing to run virtually, we have been able to successfully reach a larger population and broader geographic area. Areas we are currently supporting include Hamilton, Burlington, Brantford, Brant County, Haldimand-Norfolk, Niagara, and many areas extending beyond the South Central Region including into the GTA and Northern Ontario.







2021 Fundraising Events in Review
